PRESENTATIONS:

Cowlitz Economic Development Council (CEDC): CEDC President Ted Sprague provided an overview highlighting the council's current activities. Community Engagement Director Lindsey Cope spoke about rebranding the Kelso Downtown Revitalization Association.

<u>Thrive – Workforce Southwest Washington</u>: Workforce Southwest Washington Project Manager Melissa Boles spoke about the state funded program that focuses on job training for people that are within 130% - 200% of the federal poverty level, eligible for basic food assistance, and reside in certain areas in the community. Ordinance No. (1st Reading) Authorizing Local Sales and Use Tax relating to the Senate House Bill 1406 for Affordable and Supporting Housing: The Deputy Clerk read the proposed ordinance by title only. Upon motion by Councilmember Lefebvre, seconded by Councilmember McAllister, 'Pass on 1st reading, 'AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KELSO, WASHINGTON AUTHORIZING THE MAXIMUM

CAPACITY OF A LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX TO FUND INVESTMENTS IN AFFORDABLE AND SUPPORTIVE HOUSING, TO BE CODIFIED AT CHAPTER 3.10 OF THE KELSO MUNICIPAL CODE; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.' Discussion followed. Councilmembers McAllister, Harvey, Lefebvre, Malone, and Alexander voted yes. Councilmember Futcher voted no. Motion passed, 5 to 1.
